She Can Do No Wrong

Shemekia Copeland, Album of the Year winner and three-time Grammy nominee, takes the stage at 9 p.m.

She has the blues in her blood, but Shemekia Copeland is a legend by her own right.

The daughter of Blues Hall of Fame inductee Johnny Copeland, Shemekia got a jump early, performing at the famous Cotton Club by age 10 and pursuing a singing career in earnest by 16.

But she's earned accolades on her own, including three Grammy nominations, starting with Wicked, released in 2001.

"She can do no wrong," said Rolling Stone, who called the singer "a powerhouse, a superstar."

Her latest album, America's Child, was recognized as Album of the Year and in the Contemporary Blues Album category by the Blues Foundation this past May. Shemekia delivers the songs with fierce intent, balancing her four-alarm vocals with a more subtle approach.

It's that four-alarm voice that sets her apart and makes her special.



Her voice is instantly recognizable, and capable of being sultry, assertive and roaring. It delivers every song with unparalleled honesty and passion.

NPR summed up her "powerful vocal chops" and style as "slow-burning soul and rollicking country-blues with growling vigor and potent conviction."

She's with her peers when she performs with Eric Clapton, Bonnie Raitt, or Carlos Santana, opens for The Rolling Stones, or plays at the White House with B.B. King, Mick Jagger, Buddy Guy, Trombone Shorty, and Gary Clark, Jr.

On the heels of North Liberty Blues & BBQ performances by St. Paul and the Broken Bones, Anderson East and Fantastic Negrito, Shemekia Copeland will be right at home and in the spotlight.

"When Shemekia Copeland opens her mouth," says No Depression, cutting to the chase, "everybody pays attention. She pierces your soul. This is how you do it, and nobody does it better than Shemekia Copeland."

Admission to our live music, beginning at noon, is free. Our stage features Copeland, Southern Culture on the Skids, Gloria Hardiman, Kevin Burt, Joe and Vicki Price and Brian Johannesen.

Walk & Bike


Trail and sidewalks make getting to Centennial Park on foot or by bike a snap. St. Andrews Drive will be closed to cars from North Bend Elementary to the east entrance of Centennial Park during the festival to make it easy to walk from the west. We'll have plenty of bike parking by the pond in the park, too.

Shuttle

Shuttle buses to and from the festival will run from 10 a.m. to 11 p.m., leaving approximately every 10 minutes. Catch the Yellow Route from GreenState Credit Union, formerly UICCU, (2355 Landon Road) or the Blue Route from North Bend Elementary (2230 St Andrews Drive). Flags mark shuttle stops at both ends.

Parking

We'll have parking available at North Bend Elementary and GreenState Credit Union formerly UICCU. In addition to accessible hard-surface parking for people with handicaps, Centennial Park will have limited grass parking accessible from Jones Boulevard on the east.
